Much of the work of National RTAP is overseen by the National RTAP Review Board, whose expertise in the field of rural transit helps guide and inform the development of our products and services. Composed

of rural and tribal operators and state department of transportation representatives, the Review Board provides in-depth expertise and local perspectives to ensure that products and services are of the highest quality, easily accessible, and usable by local transit operators.

Review Board members serve for a term of three years, and calls for nominations are announced periodically. New members are selected from among nominees by a committee composed of National RTAP staff and partner organizations.

2015 Florida Triple Crown Bus Rodeo

In early April, Florida's best bus drivers and technicians will gather in St. Petersburg to participate in the 2015 Annual Florida Triple Crown Bus Rodeo. The Florida Triple Crown Bus Rodeo combines the FPTA and RTAP rodeos into a single, colossal weekend honoring all of Florida's bus maintenance technicians, paratransit and fixed route operators.

The year's event is a joint effort of the Florida Public Transportation Association (FPTA), the Florida Rural Transit Assistance Program (RTAP), the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), and the Florida Association of Coordinated Transit Systems (FACTS), and hosted by the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority (PSTA).

There will be training opportunities for the participants. The bus operator participant's skills will be tested with a written test and the on-course competition. The maintenance technicians will face similar challenges with a written test and a series of diagnostic tests.

As always, the event will conclude with the Awards Banquet that crowns and recognizes the 2015 champions in the

paratransit van and cutaway divisions, the fixed route bus division, and the maintenance technician's team competition.

The first place finishers in both the Cutaway and Mini-Van divisions will represent Florida at the May Community Transportation Association of America (CTAA) National Roadeo in Tampa, Florida.

Years Working with Current Agency: 14 years

Years Working in Transit Industry: 20 years

Biggest Surprise in Paratransit: How many agencies provide transit for their clients on the federal level but they don't coordinate it with the locals, as well as the growing need for this service.

Biggest Challenge in Paratransit: There are many challenges that we have faced: The implications of Medicaid Reform and seeing the challenges that it caused in the lives of the clients that was very stressful and challenging. It is also extremely painful to have to cut back on services when there are funding shortages. We had to cut back on educational and employment trips several years ago and that was extremely challenging going through that process, and seeing how it adversely impacted the lives of our clients. Last year we were able to restore those trips and that brought a great deal of joy to the clients as well as me. As our populations age and the need for paratransit grows, it's important to have a dedicated funding source with revenues to adequately fund the paratransit programs.

Personal Benefit of Working in Paratransit: Being able to provide a vital and critical service to people who really

need it and see the joy on their face when you are able to help them. Also taking rides with the clients and talking to them and getting to know them on a personal level. I have attended the funerals of several of our clients and have gone to the hospital to visit with them.

Community Involvement: Pastor, Pleasant Grove Baptist Church, volunteer Chaplain at Bert Fish Hospital, member of the Lake County Community Traffic Safety Team with emphasis on the Mock Crash Program; Past President of the Florida Association of Coordinated Transportation Systems (FACTS); current Secretary of Florida Public Transportation Association (FPTA).

Personal Background: I am a lifelong resident of Florida; I grew up in Mount Dora. My wife is Joyce, and I have two daughters, Asia and Keisha. We have a family dog. TRIPS Overview

The Transit Research Inspection Procurement Services (TRIPS) program has been in existence since 1995, providing agencies with the means of procuring quality vehicles at the lowest possible price.

TRIPS was developed through the insight, innovation and funding from the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Office of Freight, Logistics and Passenger Operations. TRIPS is administered and managed by the University of South Florida's (USF) Center for Urban Transportation Research (CUTR).

The mission of TRIPS is to provide public transportation agencies access to procure high quality vehicles at competitive prices, provide technical assistance and guidance to public transit agencies for vehicle procurement, research and develop transit bus specifications that improve product quality and extend the life of the vehicles procured, and conduct crash testing and bus safety analysis to increase passenger safety and comfort.

The TRIPS program is accomplishing this mission by:

- Establishing statewide contracts for procurement of certain transit vehicles.
- Developing vehicle technical specifications for all various public transit vehicles required by Florida's public

transportation systems.

- Providing technical assistance and guidelines to public transit agencies during the procurement process and coordination with the contracted dealer.
- Providing technical assistance to individual transit agency Maintenance Managers experiencing unidentified fleet and warranty issues.
- Investigating, conducting research, testing and developing component and design performance standards for the manufacture of vehicle and related components as part of vehicle technical specifications.
